CAB MEETING SUMMARY

The four MPIs presented updates on the four cores of OMNI ADRD and CAB members were provided with questions and the opportunity to respond. The following summarizes points made by members both during the meeting and a two-week response period after the meeting:

- Members were overall enthusiastic about the promise to assessing subtle cognitive changes not currently captured by existing assessments, and appreciated the opportunity to participate in the development process. They note that such subtle changes can be critical, as diagnosis of cognitive decline is often made at a later stage when functional impairments are already apparent, and when there are also simultaneous emotional and identity upheavals. They also note that validation of the proposed assessments has large potential for future interventions and prevention efforts.
- Members saw the core activities as appropriate, particularly valuing the ease and convenience of using mobile and web-based tests. They also saw a strength of the approach in ensuring these measures are applicable to broad and at-risk populations, as well as helpful to family members and caregivers.
- Though it is early in the process, members noted that some challenges may be in maintaining engagement on these tests across different people and organizations, the complexity of assessing hundreds of tests, as well as general coordination of such a large-scale project.
